# Decline in Positive Perception




### **Tuition Trends**

## Closures, Mergers & Financial Pressure

"Colleges and universities that fail to adapt risk joining the average of 11 per year that the bondrating firm Moody's says have shut down in the last three years... More are likely to go under; Moody's projects that the pace of closings will soon reach 15 per year."

- Enrollment declines
- Acquisitions
- Increase in closures
- Nownward pressures consuming energy & effort

#### **Graduate Education**

- Slight increase in apps and enrollment overall
- Crowth in online delivery
- Program growth: cyber security, data analytics, health professions, education
- ► MBA substantially disrupted


## Delivery Modes
